Using Urchin in conjunction with Google Analytics

You can use the Urchin software in conjunction with Google Analytics, but you cannot use the standard code for both on a page simultaneously. Instead you need to eliminate the call to '`__utm.js`', and add in the line '`_user=2;`' to your Google Analytics code. The following code is the complete code that should appear on all of your pages (where xxxxxx-x is replaced with your actual UA number):

If you are using the old GA code:

```
<script src="http://www.google-analytics.com/urchin.js" type="text/javascript"></script>
<script type="text/javascript">
_uacct="UA-xxxxxx-x";
_user=2;
urchinTracker();
</script>
```

If you are using the latest version of the Google Analytics code, then you will need to add in the code '`pageTracker._setLocalRemoteServerMode();`'. Thus, your resultant code should be:

```
<script type="text/javascript">
var gaJsHost = (("https:" == document.location.protocol) ? "https://ssl." : "http://www.");
document.write(unescape("%3Cscript src=" + gaJsHost + "google-analytics.com/ga.js" type="text/javascript"%3E%3C/script%3E"));
</script>
<script type="text/javascript">try{
var pageTracker = _gat._getTracker("UA-xxxxxx-x");
pageTracker._setLocalRemoteServerMode(); pageTracker._initData(); pageTracker._trackPageview();} catch(err) {}
</script>
```

If you are using the latest/asynchronous code then you need to add in the code '`_gaq.push(['_setLocalRemoteServerMode']);`' Thus, your resultant code would be:

```
<script type="text/javascript">

var _gaq = _gaq || [];
_gaq.push(['_setAccount', 'UA-xxxxxx-x']);
_gaq.push(['_setLocalRemoteServerMode']);
_gaq.push(['_trackPageview']);

(function() {
  var ga = document.createElement('script'); ga.type = 'text/javascript'; ga.async = true;
  ga.src = ('https:' == document.location.protocol ? 'https://ssl' : 'http://www') + '.google-analytics.com/ga.js';
  var s = document.getElementsByTagName('script')[0]; s.parentNode.insertBefore(ga, s);
})();

</script>
```
