

Using Checkbox Fields in a Formmail.php Form

`$(function(){ $(".Box").css("display","none"); });` You can expand your formmail.php forms to use checkbox fields, as long as you follow the proper naming convention for the checkbox fields.

Here is a standard formmail example with a few checkbox fields added:

Name

Email

Where did you hear about us? Newspaper Ad

Television Ad

Web Site

Comments

Checkbox fields must have the square brackets ([]) after each of their names, otherwise only the value of the last checkbox field will be included in the form results.

Here is the code for this form:
